TO OUR MEMBERS, DONORS AND COMMUNITY,




Back in 2018, when we first brought the Lower, Central and Upper Bucks YMCAs into one organization, we quickly discovered how our YMCA could not only work more efficiently, but be more adept at directly addressing the needs of our communities. Coming together meant more resources to combat family food insecurity, expand the availability of free community Pathway wellness programs and construct an entirely new, state-of-the-art branch in Fairless Hills. Soon thereafter, in 2022, we united the talents and skills of Hunterdon County YMCA with YMCA of Bucks County. The same results applied, and we arrived at the same truth: we are stronger together.

In 2024, we were presented with another opportunity to strengthen our service to the community: in July we formalized our agreement with Greater Valley YMCA in Lehigh and Northampton counties in PA to form one River Crossing YMCA. Today we serve communities from Fairless Hills in Lower Bucks to Pen Argyl near the Pocono Mountains and east to Flemington, NJ. As with the river's current, we are moving forward—stronger, faster and more united than ever.

This report highlights the remarkable progress we've made, showcasing how we've come together to provide resources, build resilience and create lasting change. As you move through the pages, you will get a full view of our association-wide initiatives, as well as some of the incredible work happening in the Bucks, Hunterdon and Lehigh Valley regions. River Crossing YMCA is more than just the sum of our branches and programs, we are like a river's current: a singular force of nature comprised of staff, volunteers, members and the entire community. We sincerely thank you for your support as we move forward together.

A NEW CHAPTER: **BECOMING RIVER CROSSING YMCA**

On July 1, 2024, following a 10-month management agreement, YMCA of Bucks and Hunterdon Counties and Greater Valley YMCA came together to form River Crossing YMCA, led by President/CEO Zane Moore. The name River Crossing YMCA was selected as it reflects our newly combined service geography, crossing the Delaware and Lehigh Rivers, and our mission with an eye toward the future of our organization.

Together, as one organization, we are able to call on the individual and collective strengths of staff across the association and take advantage of organizational efficiencies. This enables us to offer a greater variety of programming and mission-driven work benefiting all the communities we serve. Additionally, bringing volunteers and donors together under one philanthropic umbrella allows us to increase our resources and expand opportunities while also focusing on the expressed needs of each community. We are better positioned than ever to support those who rely on us most by providing meals, pathways to wellness and financial assistance across all our programs.

As one YMCA, we employ 2,300 individuals, serving nearly 142,000 members and participants at 12 branches, 13 early childhood centers, 20 summer camp locations and 44 school age child care programs. We provide over \$12 million of community impact annually in the form of financial assistance to individuals and families in need, as well as free programming for veterans, cancer survivors, older adults and more.

SUMMER CAMP

River Crossing YMCA operates 17 summer camp programs throughout Bucks, Lehigh and Northampton counties in Pennsylvania and three summer camps in Hunterdon County, New Jersey. In 2024, the Y hosted more than 6,839 campers, providing them with a fun, healthy and safe place they can call their own, while their families enjoy the support and supervision they rely on for their children's growth and development.

On July 25, we hosted over 750 campers at Warminster Community Park for the **Let Your Colors Shine** camp field day. Summer campers from 16 YMCA camp locations in four counties came together for a day of activities, friends-making and to be part of a singular event that is, simply put, all about them.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Let Your Colors Shine unites our communities, bringing all of our campers together for collaboration and celebration. It promotes a sense of belonging and pride, while also offering event partners an opportunity to engage with and support the next generation of leaders.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

River Crossing YMCA camps empower youth through activities that build leadership, teamwork and resilience. Through fun team-building and learning games, the Let Your Colors Shine event highlights how Y camp helps combat the summer learning slide while promoting the power of positive social interactions with new camp friends.

Y FOR ALL

Let Your Colors Shine reflects the YMCA's commitment to opportunity and fairness for all. By removing barriers such as financial constraints, we provide access to all participants, creating a sense of belonging for anyone who wants to be here. This allows children to experience first-hand that they are part of a community of kids who come from many different backgrounds, families and neighborhoods.



NOURISHING OUR COMMUNITIES: TACKLING FOOD INSECURITY TOGETHER

Access to nutritious food is essential for health and well-being, but many children, families and adults in our communities face significant barriers to affordable, healthy food. At River Crossing YMCA, we are deeply committed to addressing these challenges and ensuring that all individuals and families have access to the nourishment they need to thrive.

In the Lehigh Valley, 10.7% of residents are food insecure (pre-COVID percentage was 7.8%). Additionally, the percentage of children who are food insecure is 15% (pre-COVID was 13%). In Bucks County, more than 70% of the children we serve through child care programs in Lower Bucks, New Britain, Quakertown and Warminster are considered food insecure. Hunger leads to more illnesses, an increase in hospital visits as well as behavioral and emotional issues due to stress, exhaustion, poor attention and inadequate coping skills. Food is the most important school supply.

In 2024, River Crossing YMCA provided over **255,000 free meals and snacks** to individuals and families across the communities we serve. In Bucks, Lehigh and Northampton counties, the Y is a Certified Adult and Child Food Program (CACFP), as well as a Summer Feeding Service Program (SFSP). These federally-funded programs help provide nutritious meals and snacks to children and adults in our region and through our programs. The Y provides additional nutritious meals and snacks to children and adults who are food insecure across our association thanks to the generosity of our donors.

YMCA PARTNERS WITH GIANT FOOD COMPANY TO COMBAT FOOD INSECURITY

This past year, River Crossing YMCA expanded its partnership with grocery store chain The GIANT Company to address food insecurity in Bucks, Lehigh and Northampton counties. Through our expanded partnership with The GIANT Company, we were able to provide milk to young children in YMCA child care programs, and meals and fresh produce to families in the Lehigh Valley. Partnerships with companies like The GIANT Company and the USDA allow us to feed more children and families in the communities we serve.

USDA ADVOCACY DAY AT SLATE BELT BRANCH

On June 20, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Deputy Secretary Xochitl Torres Small and US Congresswoman Susan Wild (7th district) visited the Slate Belt branch's camp in Pen Argyl to observe the Summer Nutrition Program for children in action.

River Crossing YMCA was chosen among many organizations because of the impact we make by providing free meals to the food insecure in Pennsylvania's Slate Belt region. Before visiting with campers at lunchtime, Deputy Secretary Torres Small and Congresswoman Wild hosted a panel discussion with local community members who depend on the Y's free meal programs.

GIANT VOLUNTEERS IN BETHLEHEM

Volunteers from The GIANT Company visited the Bethlehem branch to celebrate the partnership supporting food access initiatives in Bucks County and the Lehigh Valley. They toured the branch and assembled 50 bags of locally sourced produce which were distributed free to adults in the community.

GIANT VOLUNTEERS IN MORRISVILLE

On June 4, volunteers from The GIANT Company visited the Y's Morrisville Child Care Center to distribute milk to students at lunchtime.



PATHWAY PROGRAMS

YMCA Pathway programs are specialized donor-funded programs offered free to the community to help address specific wellness needs. These programs provide full mind-body wellness opportunities and healthy connections to participants who would not be able to find similar, free services outside of the Y.

In 2024, River Crossing YMCA began to offer Pathway programs to branches in the Lehigh Valley region for the first time. The Veterans Wellness Pathway program, which provides mind and body health and social connection to military veterans and their families, was introduced to the Allentown community in the fall. Upon completing the 12-week in-person and virtual sessions, 10 Veterans Wellness participants graduated with new physical exercise, nutrition and mindfulness habits. The YMCA Veterans Wellness Pathway program is now offered throughout the year in Bucks, Lehigh and Hunterdon county YMCA branches, providing our community's military veterans valuable skills, strong friendships and a local network of resources for continued wellness.

BUILDING STRONGER COMMUNITIES: CAUSE DAY 2024 DRIVES IMPACT AND SUPPORT

River Crossing YMCA celebrated its first Cause Day as a combined organization, kicking off Cause Week at all branches on Giving Tuesday, December 3. Cause Day is an in-person initiative to inspire new donors through Cause membership, a philanthropic \$10/month recurring donation that includes perks like 24/7 access to the Y's virtual wellness platform.

During Cause Day 2024, Y staff from all 12 branches welcomed over 100 new Cause members. Cause Membership helps fund community impact programs, including financial assistance for child care, camp and free Pathway wellness programs.

River Crossing YMCA's Pathway programs are free, donor-supported wellness initiatives, designed for individuals and families with shared health goals. These include the Veterans Wellness Program, THRIVE Cancer Wellness and teen programs like Empower U and Stand Up. We thank all our Cause members for their support in strengthening our communities.





INAUGURAL FLYING LEPRECHAUN FUN RUN

River Crossing YMCA and Warminster Township Parks and Recreation welcomed over 300 children, families and volunteers to Warminster Community Park for the inaugural Flying Leprechaun Fun Run on Saturday, March 9. The fun run features a mile-long course for children ages 12 and under that took racers along the scenic trails of the park towards the dazzling, rainbow finish line located on the historic grounds of the former U.S. Naval Air Development Center.

All proceeds from the Flying Leprechaun Fun Run support the Y's financial assistance and donor-supported, free community programs.

YMCA BUCKS COUNTY STRONG 5K HONORS DICK PATTERSON FOR A LIFE OF SERVICE TO HIS COMMUNITY

Nearly 450 participants ran, jogged and walked the annual YMCA Bucks County Strong 5K and 1-Mile Fun Run on May 11 in Doylestown, PA. The Y 5K is the fourth out of six races that make up the historic Bucks 5K Series. A moment of silence was taken to remember the legacy of Dick Patterson, who had recently passed. Patterson served as director of the race series for over 20 years and was an ardent supporter of the YMCA.

"Dick was a community advocate and leader, promoting physical and mental well-being," shared YMCA Race Director Justin Grand.

"He dedicated himself to numerous nonprofit causes and was a past board member and trustee of the YMCA." Dick was awarded the 2017 Lois Burpee Award by the YMCA for exemplary volunteer leadership.

Dick Patterson's family members were named honorary Race Directors for the day. Several family members ran the race and his wife Edythe blew the air horn to start the 5K following the moment of silence.

All proceeds raised by the 5K and Fun Run benefit the community through the Y's financial assistance and community impact programs.





EMPOWERING INDEPENDENCE: LAUNCHING LIFE AFTER 21 FOR YOUNG ADULTS IN DOYLESTOWN

The Y's Life After 21 program, launched in September in Doylestown, provides young adults with the opportunity to participate in abilities-focused activities that empower them to build confidence, develop essential life skills and form meaningful friendships as they take important steps toward greater self-sufficiency.

Life After 21, tailored to each participant's needs and interests, combines community-based learning, job skills training and wellness activities for a holistic approach to personal growth. Participants engage in physical health through access to the Y's Wellness Center, group exercise classes, swimming and our 24/7 wellness platform while developing social skills through instructor-led activities.

Practical life skills are also nurtured through real-world experiences such as travel training with Doylestown's DART system and exploring the community by shopping, dining and navigating local businesses. These activities help participants gain confidence in their ability to manage day-to-day tasks independently.

LAUNCH OF THE RAISE UP OUR YOUTH CAMPAIGN AT CHOCOLOTTA: A MAJOR STEP TOWARD EXPANDING YOUTH AND COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2024, River Crossing YMCA officially launched the public phase of our Raise Up Our Youth campaign at the annual Choccolotta event, marking a transformative moment for the Quakertown branch and the Upper Bucks community. This \$3.5 million campaign is poised to significantly expand and enhance youth program spaces, creating a lasting impact on the region's youth and community members.

The Raise Up Our Youth campaign aims to create a vibrant destination for young people in the Upper Bucks region to promote connection, health and wellness. With teen loneliness and mental health challenges on the rise—illustrated by the 2021 Pennsylvania Youth Survey showing that 37.4% of Bucks County students ages 11-18 felt sad or depressed most days—the need for a supportive, engaging space has never been more critical.

The campaign will also fund the expansion of community impact programs in the Upper Bucks region. River Crossing YMCA serves Veterans, cancer survivors, pre-diabetics, seniors, individuals with differing abilities and adults recovering from mental illness in our free Pathway programs. Expanding reach in Quakertown will help the Y provide more assistance to those in need, along with volunteer opportunities for those who want to get involved.

CHOCLOTTA

The official campaign launch at Chocolotta, held in March at The Farm in Quakertown, brought together volunteers, Y members and donors to celebrate the Y's deep impact on the Upper Bucks community. The event raised essential funds for the Y's financial assistance program, helping families access life-changing opportunities like camp experiences for their children—experiences that many might not otherwise be able to afford.

One of the event's speakers, Paula Klein, shared a heartfelt story of how the Y's programs, including financial assistance, have made a profound difference in her family's life. "The financial assistance has really helped my family to continue to be members of the Y. With three foster children, they are all participating in summer camp. The kids have a blast all summer long. They love the color runs, swimming and being outdoors."

The event not only showcased the Y's vital role in the community but also highlighted the power of collective support in making a lasting difference.

BUILDING TOMORROW'S LEADERS: EMPOWER U PARTICIPANTS GAIN INSIGHT FROM COMMUNITY ENTREPRENEURS

On May 7, leaders from KeyBank visited the Doylestown branch to present a panel of community entrepreneurs to participants of the Y's Empower U Pathway program. Panelists discussed their career journeys, offering insight and guidance to the Empower U participants as they begin to think about their futures. Empower U is the free, donor-supported 6-week wellness program for teen girls aged 12-15, designed to strengthen self-esteem, positive relationships and self-reliance. Empower U participants asked questions about how to overcome career obstacles, as well as the time and resources it takes to be a business owner.

In addition to hosting our Central Bucks Empower U participants in person, we offered a virtual feed to connect Empower U participants across our entire service area, ensuring everyone could be part of the event. This innovative approach allowed us to engage a wider community and extend the impact of the program. Together with KeyBank, River Crossing YMCA remains committed to empowering and fostering growth among the youth in our community.



ANSWERING THE CALL IN FAIRLESS HILLS FOR MORE FAMILY CONNECTION AND WELLNESS

In July, the Fairless Hills branch of River Crossing YMCA announced the opening of expanded member spaces to meet the demand for more group exercise, Stay & Play child care and esports, which provides teens the healthy competition of electronic gaming along with contemporary Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Mathematics (STEAM) learning.

The Studio 1 expansion on the second floor can now accommodate more than 50 group exercise participants, and more young children can engage in purposeful play in the enhanced Stay & Play area, giving families more chances to pursue wellness together at the branch.

The new Metro Esports lounge provides a safe, supervised, hi-tech environment for youth and teens to be together in person while competing in their favorite PC or console games. Although many gamers are part of an online community, coming together at the Y allows them to build strong friendships and enjoy a sense of belonging within their own community. In addition to year-round programs and competitions, we also offer esports summer camp at the Fairless Hills, Doylestown and Warminster branches.



BUILDING TOMORROW TOGETHER: YMCA'S NEW MILESTONE IN MORRISVILLE

For over 30 years, the Y has been a cornerstone of support, a symbol of resilience and a true partner in strengthening the Morrisville community. This past February, after 30 years of renting the facility, River Crossing YMCA purchased the property at 200 North Pennsylvania Avenue in Morrisville, PA.

The Morrisville center offers early education and care for toddlers aged 12-24 months, Pre-K Counts for children aged three to five years old and school age care for students in K-fifth grade.

Transitioning to full ownership marks a new chapter, further solidifying our long-term investment in the future of Morrisville. We are excited to upgrade and renovate the facility, ensuring that the Morrisville center continues to thrive as a vibrant child learning center.



GROUP EXERCISE

The expanded studio at Fairless Hills now welcomes over 50 group exercise participants, providing more space for members to move, connect and stay active together. With this growth, the Y continues to support community wellness for all ages.



METRO ESPORTS CAMP

Esports camps in Doylestown, Fairless Hills and Warminster provided STEAM-centered skill-building to nearly 300 campers in Bucks County. Campers learned coding, digital communication and computer-building at their Ys, where YMCA camp values like teamwork and cooperation provide the foundation for collaboration.

LAUGHTER, IMPACT AND COMMUNITY: A NIGHT TO REMEMBER AT THE YMCA'S COMEDY NIGHT

"Tonight is about the kids," declared Zane Moore, president/CEO of River Crossing YMCA at the annual YMCA Comedy Night in Hunterdon County. "When we make it easier for families to send their kids to camp, or when we make it easier for families to afford child care, we make a huge difference in their lives."

Such was the spirit of joy and impact invoked at the 32nd Annual YMCA Comedy Night, held on Friday, November 22 at the Hunterdon Hills Playhouse in Hampton, NJ. With nearly 300 comedy fans in attendance, the event raised more than \$115,000 for YMCA financial assistance and community impact programs, enabling thousands of individuals and families to participate in much-needed child care, camp and personal wellness.

In addition to a silent auction, the event included a "Send Kids to Camp" appeal, raising scholarship funds for over 100 children to attend YMCA day camp this summer.

For over 100 years, the YMCA has played an integral role in the Hunterdon community providing safe, high-quality early childhood education, school age child care, summer camp and wellness programs. Since its inception, the annual Comedy Night brings community leaders, donors and volunteers together to raise essential financial support to all who rely on the Y for these services but could not otherwise afford to participate.

GROWING FUTURES: NEW INFANT CLASSROOM OPENS IN ANNANDALE

In response to the growing demand for high-quality infant care in our community, the YMCA’s Child Learning Center in Annandale, NJ proudly opened a brand-new infant classroom in 2024. This critical expansion was made possible through the generous support of the Hunterdon County Commissioners via the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Their investment allowed

the Y to purchase high-quality equipment, supplies and learning materials to support the nurturing care and development of our youngest learners, while also expanding access for working families through financial assistance.

This investment is more than just bricks and mortar. It’s about providing peace of mind for working parents and ensuring every child has the opportunity to thrive in a safe, supportive and enriching environment.



MAKING WAVES: A CELEBRATION OF ACHIEVEMENT AT THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS SWIM MEET

At the Deer Path branch of River Crossing YMCA, March brought a heartwarming display of courage, determination and community spirit as we hosted the annual Special Olympics Area 4 Swim Meet. This annual event brings together athletes from across the region, including the Hunterdon County YMCA Dolphins and teams from Somerset Hills, Hopewell Valley and beyond.

The Area 4 meet is the culmination of months of hard work, practice and unwavering support from families and volunteers. Our Dolphins swim team, which began in 1994, brought athletes to this year's competition and welcomed volunteers from the Readington Police Department to help award medals to the winning athletes.

MEETING THE NEED: OUR COMMITMENT TO EXPANDING ACCESS TO QUALITY CHILD CARE IN HUNTERDON COUNTY

For over 35 years, the YMCA Child Learning Center in Annandale, NJ has been serving Hunterdon County families with much-needed, high-quality, early education and care. Many of our enrolled families benefit from the donor-funded YMCA financial assistance program without which they would not be able to participate. As this community continues to grow, so does the need for the Y's exceptional early childhood education and care to support working families.

In January, in partnership with Clinton Public Schools, the Y began enrolling students into newly constructed classrooms at the Child Learning Center as part of the NJ Universal Preschool expansion program.

Partnering with local school districts to provide appropriate space, quality learning materials and highly qualified teachers for NJ's Universal Preschool program means that more children in our communities will be ready for kindergarten and beyond. YMCA values of hands-on learning in a supportive, cooperative and accepting environment prepares young learners for what is expected of them when they enter elementary school.

Two Universal Preschool/Pre-K classrooms currently serve 29 children, with nearly half of them participating in the extended day program, giving families confidence in their child care throughout the work day. The YMCA Child Learning Center provides NJ Star-rated early education and care to 115 total children ages six weeks to five years. As our communities grow, River Crossing YMCA is committed to meeting the need for reliable, affordable early childhood education and care.

Additionally, participants can earn one-day passes to visit one of the City of Easton's outdoor pools, with free meals available at several locations.

As the largest Thanksgiving 5K in the Lehigh Valley, each year our Y brings the community together for this fun and uplifting calorie burn in preparation for the holiday season.



WARMING HEARTS: THE YMCA'S WINTER LIFELINE FOR THOSE IN NEED

The Y's Allentown Warming Station provides overnight beds, warm meals and compassionate care to unhoused adults during the cold months, November–April. This past November, the Warming Station opened its doors for the seventh consecutive year, taking in more adults from the community than ever before. Guests check in at 7 PM each evening and check out by 7 AM the following morning, but are welcome to return each night for as long as they need. They are offered a comfortable, welcoming space, with access to free physical and mental health care services from Valley Health Partners Street Medicine Program, Treatment Trends, Inc. and Valley Youth House Synergy Project. In 2024, the Y and its partners provided care for 268 individuals at the Warming Station, offering a total of 6,594 overnight stays.

Last April, just two weeks after the Warming Station closed for the season, a fire broke out in Allentown destroying homes and displacing adults and families. In partnership with the Pennsylvania Rivers Chapter of the American Red Cross, the YMCA pivoted to reopen the Warming Station. This offered residents impacted by the fire a temporary haven while they worked to reconnect with family and make arrangements for the future. This quick response demonstrates that the Y is always ready to step up as a trusted partner in times of crisis, ensuring that community members receive the support they need when they need it most.

The Warming Station provides a lifeline for those facing homelessness in our community and River Crossing YMCA is grateful to the donors and community partners who help us make it happen year after year.

The newly constructed LVHN Childcare Center, operated by the YMCA in the Westgate Mall on Schoenersville Road, opened on September 9, welcoming families of LVHN colleagues as well as the broader community.

Located across from the LVHN-Muhlenburg campus, the center is open Monday through Friday 6 AM-6 PM, and includes nine classrooms for infants through Pre-K, a multi-purpose room for indoor gross-motor activities, a full kitchen and two outdoor playgrounds.

"I can see the positive impact this child care center has on my kids' development and I am beyond grateful for the nurturing, supportive community the Y has created." shared Ashley Liotti, an LVHN colleague and mother of two children enrolled at the center.



